Susan B. Anthony's Annual Birthday Celebration

Marjorie Childer's presentation will discuss the importance of Quilting and Quilt Circles through the Abolition and Suffrage Movements. A NEW ADVENTURE FOR THE MUSEUM

SBABM Executive Director Colleen Janz was a big winner at the New England Museum Association Conference (NEMA) this November. What is this awesome prize you might ask? Well, it is Museum Trek by Trek Solver, valued at \$2,500. Museum Trek allows players to search for clues through a museum's exhibits, actively engaged in the Trek, using an app on their smart phone.

Each Trek is unique, highlighting museum-specific exhibits. Some Treks are scavenger hunts, while others prompt the player to follow clues on a set path. Still, others may lead players on a choose-your-own-adventure style story throughout the museum.

Those with the app can locate museums that participate, similar to geo-caching, enticing more Birthplace visitors.


The SBABM will have an "Adventure" style trek where visitors will learn about Susan from birth through reforms, whereas the scavenger hunt model will be used for younger children.



The Trek Solver Staff will come to the museum, photograph the museum, design and prepare the trek with innovative clues and story boards, as well as educate the volunteers how to use the app. Promotional materials will be provided and will highlight the Birthplace's involvement.

The Birthplace Museum will reach out to our neighboring museums to join in the fun, some that have been extended an invitation are Mass MoCA, North Adams Holocaust Museum, The Clark Art, The Motorcycle Museum, the Quaker Meeting House, Hancock Shaker Village, The Hoosac Tunnel Museum, Bennington Museum, Crane Museum, Historic Deerfield and the Bidwell House.

The Birthplace is among the first to participate in this ground-breaking program and look forward to sharing this educational and fun opportunity with our visitors and the Berkshire community as a whole.

ANTHONY QUILT IS COMING HOME

The Birthplace Museum has been on a three-year adventure to create a replica of the LeMoyne Star quilt made by Susan B. Anthony in 1835 when she was 15 years old. Sixty-four quilters, many from the Berkshires, hand-stitched the top layer. Thirteen months later, when the women finished, they carefully boxed the quilt top and sent it off to the Legler Barn Museum in Lenexa, KA, for completion. Thirteen women worked on it there.

The eight-point LeMoyne star pattern is pieced with predominantly indigo and tan calicos with muslin backing that resemble as closely as possible young Susan's original fabrics. The original quilt is in storage at the Rochester Museum and Science Center because it is too fragile for public display.

The Birthplace Museum selected Kansas for the finishing phase of the quilt because two of Susan's brothers moved there to take part in that state's antislavery activities and because Kansas was one of the early states to give women the vote.

According to Cheshire, MA, quilter Gail Miller, who coordinated the project in the Berkshires, "Our quilters came from as far as Windsor and Bennington in the north and Great Barrington in the south."

"We considered it an honor to finish the quilt for the Susan B Anthony Birthplace Museum," Jeanne Poore, project coordinator for the Legler Barn Quilters, said.

The quilt will return to the Berkshires this November and make its public debut at the Susan B. Anthony birthday celebration on February 16, 2014, at the Adams Public Library. After that, it will be permanently on display at the Birthplace Museum.

ABOUT THE SUSAN B. ANTHONY BIRTHPLACE MUSEUM

In 2006 Birthplace Museum founders took on the task of restoring the house, which had been vacant for 11 years and formally privately owned. The SBA Birthplace Museum opened in the spring of 2010.

This rural, Federal-style home, now listed in the National Register, contains a portrait gallery, legacy room, and birthing room — depicting family and work life in the early 1800s—as well as authentic period pieces, ephemera, and a detailed timeline.
